

C urrounded on three sides by the Parramatta River and offering some of Sydney's best waterfront views, the suburb of Drummoyne is where a young family decided to create their dream home. The homeowners already had years of experience developing high-end properties for others, but this marked the first time they had built something for themselves.

After discovering the work of sJs Interior Design on Instagram, the couple — who have three young daughters — reached out to the studio's founder Sarah Jayne Marriott. 'Our style and design aesthetic resonated with them,' Marriott says. 'From the beginning, they were open and responsive to our conceptual ideas, trusting us to take on their vision to create something bespoke and beautiful.'

The four-bedroom home is organised over three levels: on the basement level are a laundry, powder room, garage and wine storage unit, the ground floor is dedicated to the living and entertaining areas, and the upper level is reserved for private spaces. 'Architecturally, the house is artfully restrained to celebrate form and texture, and tonal materials like concrete, terrazzo and white marble enhance the richness of the dark timber and bronze elements,'Marriott explains.'Within this calm and composed structure, we layered soft elements like wool rugs, linen upholstery and sheers, and solid timber furniture.'


Many pieces were custom designed by sJs to suit Text the owners' lifestyle and the space itself. 'Our Karine Monié clients have a network of artisans we were able to connect with, so we came up with a design that incorporated limestone left over from the stair plinth and solid American walnut to create the oversized central coffee table,' says Marriott. Other custom pieces include the refined yet comfortable sofa in the living room and the sculptural kitchen island. 'The clients were adventurous,' Marriott says. 'They wanted showpieces that no one else has.'


Bursts of colour come via artworks and cushions, Marriott's 'final styling layer' for every project. "This layer is like the heart and soul of the rooms," she says. 'It's where the clients' personalities can shine through and where feelings are evoked.' Not only do the art pieces introduce colour, they also break up the expansive walls and provide an 'opportunity to be bold in such a minimal space', as Marriott points out.

Inspired by the Australian landscape, the textures and tones of the home reveal layers of understated luxury. 'The clients' building knowledge and expertise meant we were able to achieve a high level of detailing in the design,' Marriott says. This attention to detail pervades every nook.




